Marco Morrone - Orchestra Conductor, Composer and Pianist

He has been working as Orchestra Conductor in Samsun State Opera and Ballet House since September 2018. In April 2019, in "the Second Gaziantep International Opera Ballet Festival", he performed "Arşın Mal Alan" written by Üzeyir Hacıbeyov, with the Samsun Opera House for the eighth time in the season. In 19th March 2019 in Erimtan Museum in Ankara a concert dedicated to his first performances of compositions for guitar was performed. In 2016 he wrote a new ballet on "Alexander the Great". In 2017 the ballet was accepted in the Turkish Opera Repertoire. He is writing a new opera for a new international project in Europe and Middle East area. He conducted the "Izmir State Symphonic Orchestra" in a concert on 11th May 2018. From January 2015 until March 2016 he worked as choir conductor at the "Istanbul Opera House". In 2014 he was artistic director and conducted "Gianni Schicchi" by Puccini in the Italian Embassy in Ankara and in Istanbul with the Italian Institute of Culture.

He was born in Italy. He studied in Italy where he obtained three diplomas (master degree): Piano, Orchestra Conducting, Composition. He also attended several masterclasses in Orchestra Conducting, Choir Conducting and Piano (Chigiana Academy of Siena, Musical Academy of Pescara). He studied orchestra conducting with Maestro Gianluigi Gelmetti, Donato Renzetti, Marcello Bufalini and Bruno Aprea. His composition studies had been under the guidance of Matteo D'Amico and Francesco Telli. He studied piano with Sergio Perticaroli and Carmela Pistillo. He performed many piano Recitals in Rome, in Milano and in Turkey in co-operation with UNHCR, Italian Embassy and Italian Institute of Culture of Ankara since 1996.

In 2012 he created and established in Roma the "Refu Jam Choir and Orchestra Project". This project is dedicated to migrants and to the positive effects of different cultures meeting together. The Refu Jam Project has in Rome a music school of more than 120 students and aims to be established in other countries in the world.

Vukasin Rodic

He plays string instruments from traditional Serbian to mandolin, ukulele, acoustic guitars; folk, classical and electric. Besides, he compose music and write lyrics. He records and performs in many clubs, on TV and radio. He has been playing with several cover groups: Plavi Pticic Prepelicic; Dedas; Babas; Novosadska Ritam Sekcija; 31, February since the second half of the eighties.

Ankara International Choir

The choir was founded by M° Marco Morrone in September 2014 at Turkish American Association in Ankara. The choir members are amateurs, volunteered music lovers who are coming from different countries (Turkey, the USA, Russia, Canada, Hungary, Germany, France, South Korea, Holland, Belgium, Greece...), professions and age groups. The choir has performed many concerts since 2014 in different venues as Embassy of Italy, Turkish American Association, French Institute and METU Vişnelik Alumni Association, Embassy of Vatican, Santa Maria Mater Ecclesiae, Rome in Italy, Santa Maria Ecclesiae for Izmir Italian Consulate. The deputy conductor of the choir is **Çiğdem AYTEPE**, Hacettepe State Conservatory.
